#### **GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT**

# THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT WILL FORM PART OF ALL BID DOCUMENTS AND MAY NOT BE AMENDED

- **1. Definitions 1.** The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
  - 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
  - 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
  - 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
  - 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
  - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
  - 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
  - 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
  - 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
  - 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
  - 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
  - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
  - 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier



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and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.
- **2. Application** 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales,

- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.
- **3. General** 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
  - 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za
- **4. Standards** 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, 5. Use of contract disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, documents plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on and behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other information; than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the inspection. contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
  - 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
  - 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
  - 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.
- 6. Patent rights 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 7. Performance 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
  - 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the



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remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be

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returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.
- **9. Packing** 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
  - 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.
- **10. Delivery and** 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
  - 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- **11. Insurance** 11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.
- **12. Transportation** 12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.
- **13. Incidental**<br/>services13.1The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following<br/>services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
  - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
  - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
  - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
  - (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
  - (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

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- **21. Delays in the**<br/>supplier's<br/>performance21.1<br/>Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made<br/>by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by<br/>the purchaser in the contract.
  - 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
  - 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
  - 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.
  - 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
  - 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.
- 22. Penalties 22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.
- 23. Termination for 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
  - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;



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- (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer/Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer/Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which control over the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer/Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
  - (i) the name and address of the supplier and/or person restricted by the purchaser;
  - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
  - (iii) the period of restriction; and
  - (iv) the reasons for the restriction

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an office as contemplated in sections 12 and 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorse on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years.



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The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

- 24. If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has /have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and or terminate the contract in whole or part, and/or restrict the bidder (s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and/or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor concerned.



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#### SECTION 3

#### SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THE BID

- 1. The successful bidder is entitled to general knowledge acquired in the execution of this agreement and may use it, provided it is not to be detriment to the NPA.
- 2. Bids submitted must be in line with the detailed specification. Failure to bid accordingly will result in the disqualification of the bids.
- 3. The bidders shall not qualify the bid proposal with their own conditions. The NPA may, at any time or times prior to the bid submission date, issue to the bidders any amendment, annexure or addendum to bid documents. No amendment, annexure or addendum will form part of the bid documents unless it is in writing and expressly stated that it shall form part of the bid document.
- 4. The NPA reserves the right;
  - a) To enter into negotiation with one or more bidders regarding the terms and conditions, including price(s) of a proposed contract before or after the conclusion of the contract.
  - b) Not to appoint and/or to terminate the bid process at any time and shall not be bound to accept the lowest bid or proposal.
  - c) To award to one or more service provider/s.
  - d) To cancel any subscription and publications, which are not carried out to its satisfaction and claim credit note of its account within thirty (30) days.
  - e) To add and/or update the items as an when necessary this will be done in consultation with the successful service provider.
  - f) To request quotations as and when required for new and electronic books that are not on the enclosed pricing schedule lists.
  - g) To use any service provider on its panel in its exclusive discretion based.
  - h) To conduct site inspections, product evaluation, or explanatory meetings in order to assess the ability of the bidder to supply and deliver the required items. This will be done before/or after adjudication of the bid. The site visit will be carried out with shortlisted bidders only.
- 5. The NPA may request written clarification or further information regarding any aspect of this bid. The bidders must supply the requested information in writing within two (2) working days after the request has been made, otherwise the proposal may be disqualified.
- 6. The NPA will not be liable for any expenses incurred by the bidders during the bidding process.
- 7. Certified copies of CIPC company registration documents must be submitted with the bid.
- 8. A valid and original tax clearance certificate must be submitted with the bid. Failure to comply will disqualify the bid submission or proposal.
- 9. Any completion of **bid documents in pencil, correction fluid (Tippex) or erasable ink** will not be acceptable and will automatically disqualify the submitted bid.

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- 10. Preferential consideration will be given to bidders that are legal entities. In the case of Regional Sub-contracting or joint venture agreement, the NPA will enter into a single contract with a principal service provider.
- 11. Bidding companies must clearly indicate if they envisage outsourcing part of the project. The status of the company to which work is outsourced with regard to the B-BBEE status level contribution must be clearly indicated.
- 12. The NPA will enter into a Service Level Agreement with the successful bidder, effective from the date of bid award, taking all aspects of the contract into account.
- 13. Under no circumstances will negotiation with any bidders constitute an award or promise / undertaking to award the contract.
- 14. The successful service provider will be subjected to a security screening investigation by the NPA at any stage during the duration of this contract. If the results thereof are negative and/or unfavorable and/or have a material or adverse effect to the carrying out of this contract, NPA shall be entitled to cancel this contract immediately, in writing.
- 15. Bidders are requested to endorse their signature/initial on every page of the bid document. Furthermore, bidders must ensure that each and every place where a signature is required is correctly and fully signed including witnesses where applicable.

#### THE SERVICE PROVIDER IS REQUIRED TO:

- 16. The successful service provider will be expected to provide items of an acceptable quality (i.e. at least equal to reasonable industry standards) and which meet the specification provided in section 8. Items delivered must be unused and new and have not expired or about to expire.
- 17. The service provider must have the infrastructure (physical premises) and the capacity to supply and deliver items required at the NPA VGM Building and NPA regional DPP offices. - 20. Being on the panel of approved service providers does not place any obligation to the NPA to use the service of such service provider or entitle such service provider to any benefit during the duration of the contract.
- 21. Deliveries will be as stipulated in the purchase orders, taking into consideration the maximum time of thirty (30) days, which shall be allowed from the date of order for the supply and delivery of national and international publications. It is the service providers' **responsibility to ensure that the items are cleared at Customs and Excise.**
- 22. If the publishing of any publication is discontinued the service provider must obtain and provide a credit note within thirty (30) days after notification of the discontinuance of the publication.



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- 23. Bidders are expected to provide prices/ quotes per line items.
- 24. The service provider must inform the NPA, within thirty (30) days of receiving an order, if the publications are available or not.
- 25. The contract will provide that approved service providers must, during the duration of the contract, inform the NPA of any new publications are available or not.
- 26. Any defective, damaged or poorly bound publications delivered, shall be replaced free of charge. Poor copies, e.g. photocopies of loose-leaf publications or updates amendments will not be accepted and will also be replaced free of charge. If such loose-leaf publications cannot be replaced, the NPA shall be reimbursed by means of a credit note. Credit must be passed within thirty (30) days.
- 27. In the case of national and international publications not reaching their destination, the service provider will be responsible for the replacement.

#### GENERAL

- 28. THE BID PROPOSAL DOCUMENT SHOULD INCLUDE BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING IN DETAIL:
- 28.1 Bidders profile short summary and description of the key features of the bidder.

- 28.2 **Proposed methodology, plan and timelines-** In this section, the bidder must demonstrate the understanding of the project indicating how its tasks and deliverables will be carried out, namely:
  - Provide a detailed proposals and/or work plan demonstrating the approach to be used to carry out services required and how project deliverables and timelines will be achieved.
  - Ability and capacity to deliver within agreed times after purchase order has been placed.
  - Indicate sufficient resources and infrastructure to undertake this project.
- 28.3 **References and performance capabilities** Bidders must provide information demonstrating specific related experience supplying of publications and services in successfully providing similar projects such claims must be supported with sufficient references to permit the National Prosecuting Authority to verify claimed capabilities. To support all claims of experience presented and to assist the National Prosecuting Authority in reviewing and evaluating the proposals, bidders are requested to provide the following:
  - At least two (2) signed reference letters or more of previous clients where services required by this contract were offered, listing the services received, indicating client's satisfaction with bidder's delivery of the services.,
- 28.4 **Financial Stability** Evidence must be provided on the financial viability of the bidder to carry out the project of this scale. The bidder must provide the latest (not older than 18 months as at close of the bid) audited financial statements as presented by an independent auditor/accounting officer. Failure to provide financial statements as required will result in the bidder being scored zero (0) in this section of the functional evaluation.



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#### **SECTION 4**

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#### **SECTION 6**

#### **EVALUATION AND SELECTION PROCESS**

All bids received will be evaluated in accordance with the **90/10** preference point system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2011. The evaluation process comprises the following phases:

#### PHASE 1: SCREENING PROCESS (COMPLETENESS OF DOCUMENTATION)

During this phase bids will be reviewed to determine compliance with all standard bidding documents, and such documents must be signed by a duly authorized representative. Tax matters will also be reviewed as to whether an original and valid tax clearance certificate has been submitted at closing date and time of bid.

#### PHASE 2: FUNCTIONAL EVALUATION

Only bidders that have met the screening process will be qualified for functional evaluation. In this phase the evaluation will be based on the bidder's response in respect of the bid proposal (evaluated on the minimum functional terms of references).
