1. BID SUBMISSION:

- 1.1. BIDS MUST BE DELIVERED BY THE STIPULATED TIME TO THE CORRECT ADDRESS. LATE BIDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED FOR CONSIDERATION.
- 1.2. **ALL BIDS MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE OFFICIAL FORMS PROVIDED (NOT TO BE RE-TYPED) OR IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED IN THE BID DOCUMENT.**
- 1.3. THIS BID IS SUBJECT TO THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT POLICY FRAMEWORK ACT, 2000 AND THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS, THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (GCC) AND, IF APPLICABLE, ANY OTHER SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.
- 1.4. **THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER WILL BE REQUIRED TO FILL IN AND SIGN A WRITTEN CONTRACT FORM (SBD7).**

2. TAX COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 2.5 IN BIDS WHERE CONSORTIA / JOINT VENTURES / SUB-CONTRACTORS ARE INVOLVED; EACH PARTY MUST SUBMIT A SEPARATE TCS CERTIFICATE / PIN / CSD NUMBER.
- 2.6 WHERE NO TCS PIN IS AVAILABLE BUT THE BIDDER IS REGISTERED ON THE CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE (CSD), A CSD NUMBER MUST BE PROVIDED.

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SECTION 2

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

THE GENERAL CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT WILL FORM PART OF ALL BID DOCUMENTS AND MAY NOT BE AMENDED

- 1. Definitions**
- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
 - 1.1 “Closing time” means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
 - 1.2 “Contract” means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
 - 1.3 “Contract price” means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
 - 1.4 “Corrupt practice” means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
 - 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
 - 1.6 “Country of origin” means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
 - 1.7 “Day” means calendar day.
 - 1.8 “Delivery” means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
 - 1.9 “Delivery ex stock” means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
 - 1.10 “Delivery into consignees store or to his site” means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
 - 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
 - 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

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- 1.13 “Fraudulent practice” means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 “GCC” means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 “Goods” means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 “Imported content” means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 “Local content” means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 “Manufacture” means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 “Order” means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 “Project site,” where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 “Purchaser” means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 “Republic” means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 “SCC” means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 “Services” means those functional services ancillaries to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 “Written” or “in writing” means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.

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- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.
- 3. General**
 - 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
 - 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za
- 4. Standards**
 - 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.
- 5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.**
 - 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
 - 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
 - 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
 - 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.
- 6. Patent rights**
 - 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.
- 7. Performance security**
 - 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in the SCC.
 - 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
 - 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque

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7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in the SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
- 8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

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The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

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| 10. Delivery and documents | 10.1 | Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC. |
| | 10.2 | Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC. |
| 11. Insurance | 11.1 | The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC. |
| 12. Transportation | 12.1 | Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC. |
| 13. Incidental services | 13.1 | The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods; (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods; (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods; (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods. |
| | 13.2 | Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services. |
| 14. Spare parts | 14.1 | As specified in the SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested. |

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| 15. Warranty | 15.1 | The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination. |
| | 15.2 | This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC. |
| | 15.3 | The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. |
| | 15.4 | Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser. |
| | 15.5 | If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract. |
| 16. Payment | 16.1 | The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC. |
| | 16.2 | The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract. |
| | 16.3 | Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier. |
| | 16.4 | Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC. |
| 17. Prices | 17.1 | Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be. |
| 18. Contract amendments | 18.1 | No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned. |

23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer/Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer/Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which control over the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer/Authority actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) the name and address of the supplier and/or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) the period of restriction; and
- (iv) the reasons for the restriction

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 and 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and

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not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

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SECTION 3

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THE BID

1. Bids submitted must be in line with the detailed terms of reference. Failure to bid accordingly will result in the disqualification of the bid.
2. Bidders' attention is drawn to the fact that amendments to any of the Special Conditions will result in their bids being disqualified.
3. The NPA may at any time or times prior to the bid submission date, issue to the bidders any amendment, annexure, or addendum to bid documents. No amendment, annexure or addendum will form part of the bid documents unless it is in writing and expressly stated that it shall form part of the bid documents.
4. **NPA reserves the right.**
 - 4.1 Not to appoint and/or cancel the bid at any time and shall not be bound to accept the lowest bid or proposal.
 - 4.2 To award a bid to one or more service providers.
 - 4.3 To award the bid as a whole or in part.
 - 4.4 To enter into negotiation with one or more bidders regarding any terms and conditions, including price(s), of a proposed contract before or after the conclusion of the contract. (BAFO "Best and Final Offer").
 - 4.5 To amend any bid condition, validity period, or extend the closing date of bids.
 - 4.6 To use any service provider on its panel in its exclusive discretion based, inter alia, on up-to-date information, the functionality offered, the cost effectiveness and ease of use of the service, the accuracy and comprehensiveness of the information provided, the speed of the service, and the other factors outlined in service schedule.
 - 4.7 To advertise and supplement the panel of service providers to provide any service those on the panel do not provide or where those service/s provided by existing service providers may be provided by other service providers more cost effectively.
 - 4.8 To cancel and/or terminate the bid process at any stage, including after the closing date and/or after presentations have been made, and/or after bids have been evaluated and/or after shortlisted bidders have been notified of their status.
 - 4.9 To conduct site inspections and or due diligence, product evaluation or explanatory meetings to verify the nature and quality of services offered by the bidder. This will be done before/or after adjudication of the bid. The site inspection and or due diligence will be carried out with shortlisted bidders only.
5. As per National Treasury Instruction note no: 9 of 2017/18 bidders are required to register their companies on the government Central Supplier Database (CSD) and include in their bid a copy of their Master Registration Number (Supplier Number).
6. Bidders are required to provide tax compliance status PIN or the Central Supplier Database Master Registration Number (MAAA Number) to enable the NPA to view their tax profile and verify the bidder's tax compliance status.

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7. Foreign suppliers with neither South African tax obligation nor history of doing business in South Africa must complete a pre-award questionnaire on the Standard Bidding Document 1 for their tax obligation categorization.
8. Bidders must submit documentary proof of the existence of joint ventures and/or consortium arrangements. The NPA will accept signed agreements as acceptable proof of the existence of a joint venture and/or consortium arrangement. The joint venture and/or consortium agreements must clearly set out the roles and responsibilities of the Lead Partner and joint venture and/or consortium party. The agreement must also identify the Lead Partner, with the power of attorney to bind the other party/parties in respect of matters pertaining to the joint venture and/or consortium arrangement.
9. The NPA will enter a contract with the successful bidder, effective from the date of bid award and it will contain a service level agreement taking all aspects of the contract into account.

13. Preferential consideration will be given to bidders that are legal entities. In the case of Sub-contracting, the NPA will enter into a single contract with a principal bidder.
14. The bidder will be subject to a security screening investigation by the NPA at any stage before or during the duration of the contract. If the results thereof are negative and/or unfavorable and/or have a material or adverse effect to the carrying out of the contract, the NPA shall be entitled to refuse to enter into a contract or cancel the contract.
15. Any completion of bid document in pencil, correction fluid (Tippex) or erasable ink will not be acceptable and will automatically disqualify the submitted bid.
16. Bidders are requested to endorse their signature on every page of the bid document.
17. The NPA will not be liable for any expenses incurred by the bidders during the bidding process.
18. **CONFLICT OF INTEREST, CORRUPTION AND FRAUD**
 - 18.1 The NPA reserves its right to disqualify any bidder who with or without their company / business, whether in respect of the NPA or any other government organ or entity and whether from the Republic of South Africa or otherwise ("Government Entity"), –

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- 18.2 Engages in any collusive tendering, anti-competitive conduct, or any other similar conduct, including but not limited to any collusion with any other Bidder or company / business in respect of the subject matter of this bid;
- 18.2 Seeks any assistance, other than assistance officially provided by a Government Entity, from any employee, advisor, or other representative of a Government Entity to obtain any unlawful advantage in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;
- 18.3 Makes or offers any gift, gratuity, anything of value or other inducement, whether lawful or unlawful, to any of the NPA's officers, directors, employees, advisors, or other representatives;
- 18.4 Accepts anything of value or an inducement that would or may provide financial gain, advantage, or benefit in relation to procurement or services provided or to be provided to a Government Entity;
- 18.5 Pays or agrees to pay to any person any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration, that is contingent upon or results from the award of any tender, contract, right or entitlement which is in any way related to procurement or the rendering of any services to a Government Entity; has in the past engaged in any matter referred above.

19 INDEMNITY

- 19.1 If a Bidder breaches the conditions of this bid and, as a result of that breach, the NPA incurs costs or damages (including, without limitation, the cost of any investigations, procedural impairment, repetition of all or part of the bid process or enforcement of intellectual property rights / confidentiality obligations), then the Bidder indemnifies and holds the NPA harmless from any and all such costs which the NPA may incur and for any damages or losses the NPA may suffer.

20 PRECEDENCE

- 20.1 This document will prevail over any information provided during any briefing session whether oral or written, unless such written information provided, expressly amends this document by reference.

21 TAX COMPLIANCE

- 21.1 No award shall be made to a Bidder whose tax matters are not in order. The NPA reserves the right to withdraw an award made to a service provider in the event that it is established that such service provider did not remain tax compliant for the full term of the contract.

22 GOVERNING LAW

- 22.1 South African law governs this bid and the bid response process. The Bidder agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the South African courts in any dispute of any kind that may arise out of or in connection with the subject matter of this bid, the bid itself and all processes associated with the bid.

23 THE SERVICE PROVIDER IS REQUIRED TO:

- 23.1 Indicate what sources of information is used to populate their database for individual traces, company, and deed searches.
- 23.2 Being on the panel of approved service providers does not place any obligation on the NPA to use the services of such service provider or entitle such service provider to any benefit during the duration of the contract.
- 23.3 The bidder should indicate the type of security provided on their systems. (i.e., access control, encryption etc.) The data must be secured when traversing the Internet.

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- 23.4 The contract will provide that approved service providers must, during the duration of the contact, inform the NPA of any new services that they develop and are able to provide along with a rates schedule for such services, to enable the NPA to evaluate such services and decide whether to utilize such services.
- 23.5 Bidders must specify an anticipated rate schedule for the next three (3) years, as well as an indication of **unconditional discounts** that may be available to the NPA for different levels of use, for example:

- 25.2 **Track record and experience** - The bidder must provide information that demonstrates specific related experience in successfully providing similar services. To support all claims of experience presented in the bid, the bidder shall provide sufficient references that it has successfully completed similar projects in the past. To assist the NPA in the review and evaluation of the proposal, it is requested that proof must be provided in the following format:
- 25.2.1 One (1) or more signed reference letters on the client's letterhead where services required by this contract were offered, listing the services received, indicating client's satisfaction, contract value, budget as well as completing Section 10. (**Note** that the focus to these letters should address the relevant work experience of the bidder, not the proposed approach).
- 25.3 **Project success factors in terms of the proposed applications** – the bidder must demonstrate a good understanding of what is required to provide a satisfactory service.
- 25.4 **Team expertise/resources** – The bidder must describe its proposed support structure, including roles and responsibility of the staff assigned to the project the NPA.

26 The bidder shall be responsible for system and data integrity during the course of the contract.

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SECTION 4

4.2 It is the responsibility of the bidder to ensure that bid documents reach the NPA on or before the closing date and time of the bid on the addresses as outline in paragraph 4.1 above. The NPA will NOT take responsibility for any bid documents received late.

5. MARKING ON BID ENVELOPE / PACK

5.1 The proposals must be submitted in **two (2) envelopes**. The objective of the exercise is to evaluate the technical proposal section without reference to the rates/price section, ensuring both sections are evaluated fairly and unbiased.

5.2 The **first (1st) envelope** holds all documents excluding the rates schedule and any detailed supporting pricing documentation (if applicable). The **second (2nd) envelope** holds the rates schedule (pricing). An outer envelope encloses both envelopes that have the envelope addressing as stated in this document.

5.3 The NPA only opens the technical proposal – the first envelope – at the evaluation stage and only opens the rates/pricing schedule – the second envelope – for those bidders who met the predefined functionality threshold at the proposal evaluation.

5.4 Bids should be submitted in a sealed envelope, or sealed pack if too big for envelopes marked as follows:

6. LATE BIDS

6.1 Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived even one second after 11:00am or any time thereafter. The tender (bid) box shall be locked at exactly 11:00am and bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances, such as traffic problems, getting lost etc. Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids are dispatched allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of bid.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.
